1. Overview

The instructions explain procedures of how to add Third-Party Software Update Catalog for Panasonic products in Microsoft Configuration Manager. The catalog allows you to publish drivers and BIOS to your software update point, and then deploy them to clients.

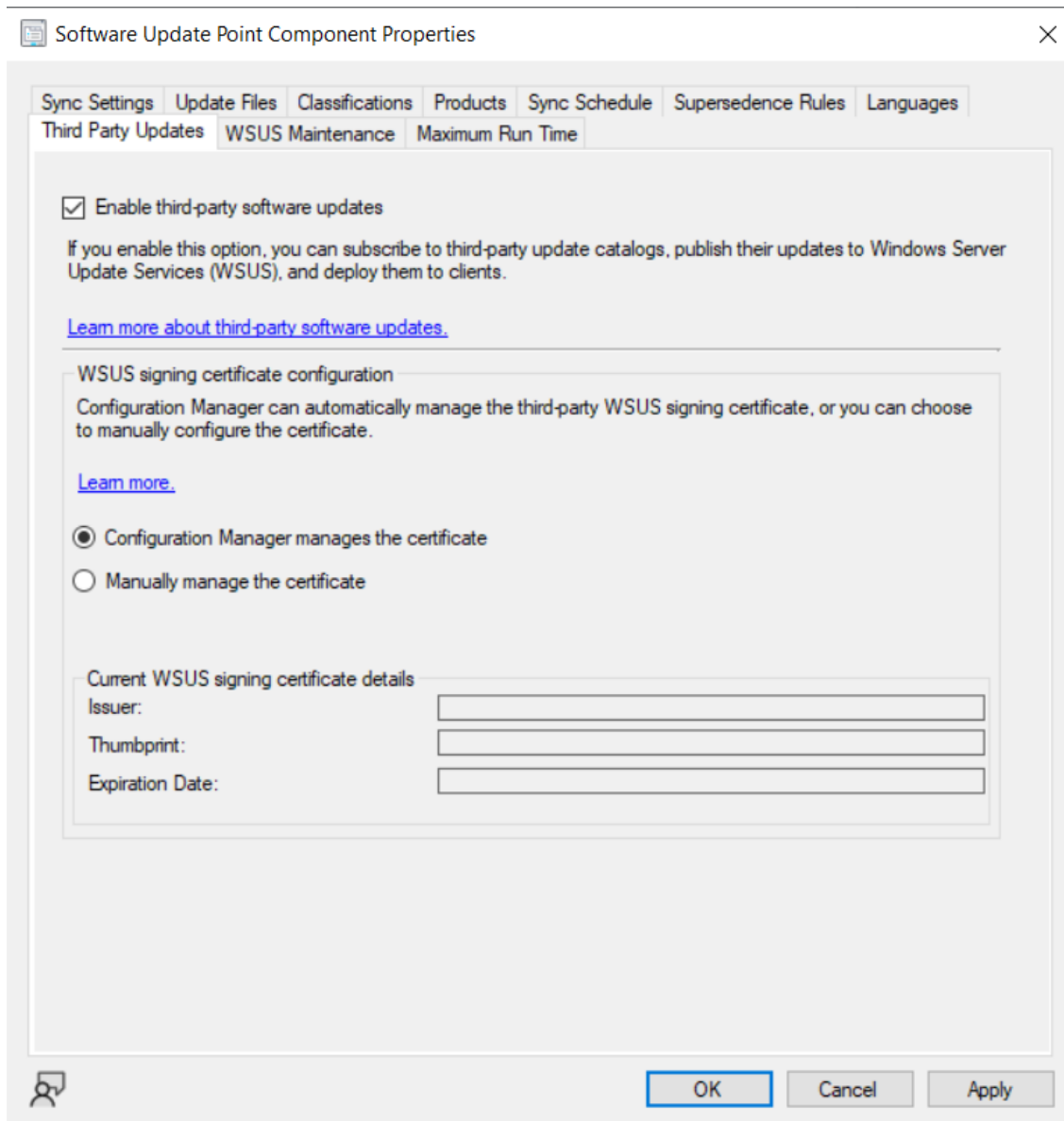

4. Add Client Updates Catalog

Before subscribing Client Updates Catalog, enable Third Party Updates feature in Configuration Manager and add the catalog to Custom Catalog.

4.1. Enable Third Party Updates

Select **Administration > Site Configuration > Sites > Configure Site Components > Software Update Point > Third Party Updates**. Check **Enable third-party software updates**.

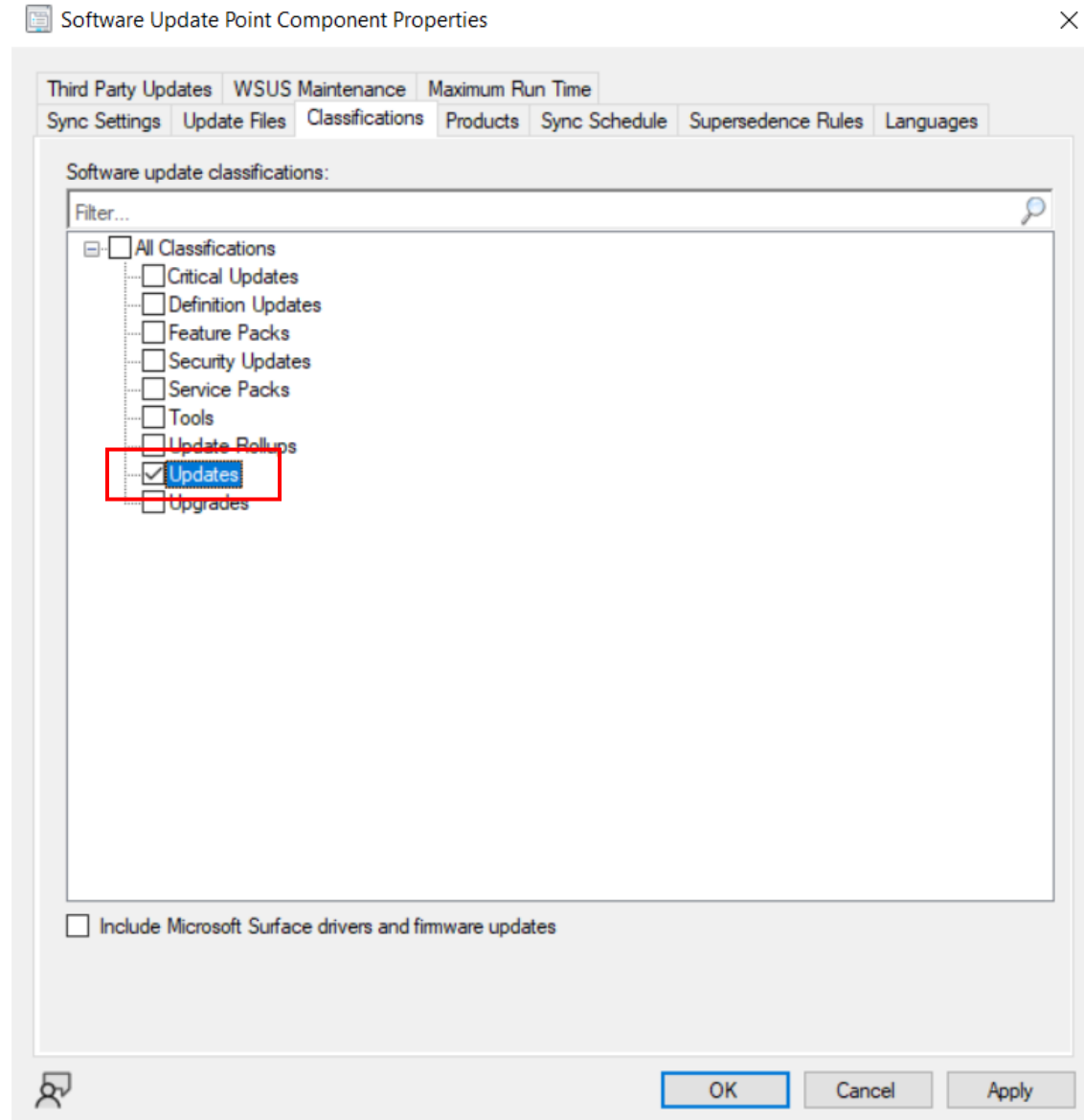

Confirm that “Updates” is checked, because Third Party Updates are classified as “Updates”.

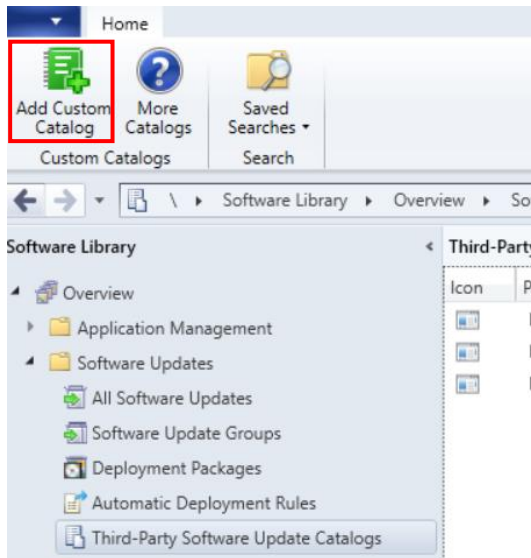
Select **Administration > Site Configuration > Sites > Configure Site Components > Software Update Point > Classifications**. Check **Updates**.

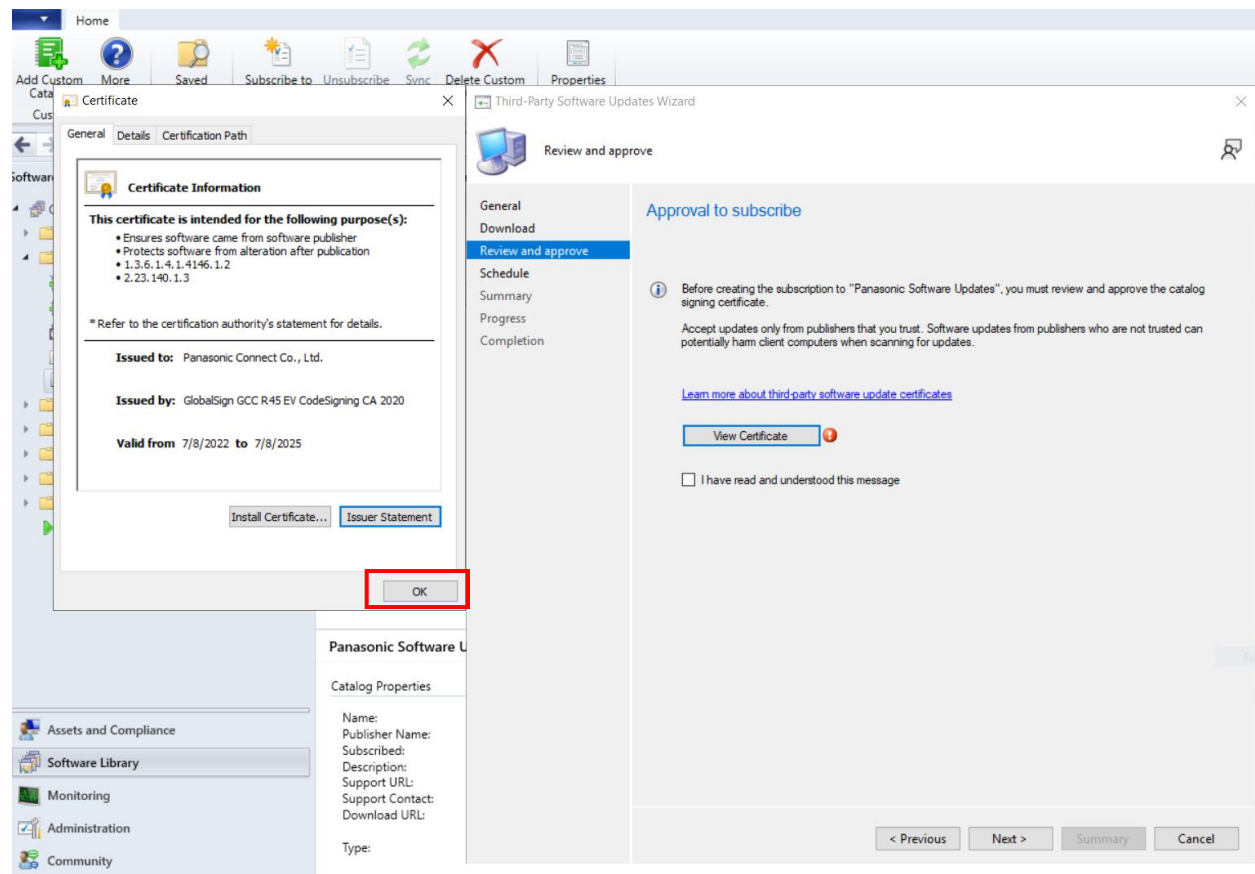

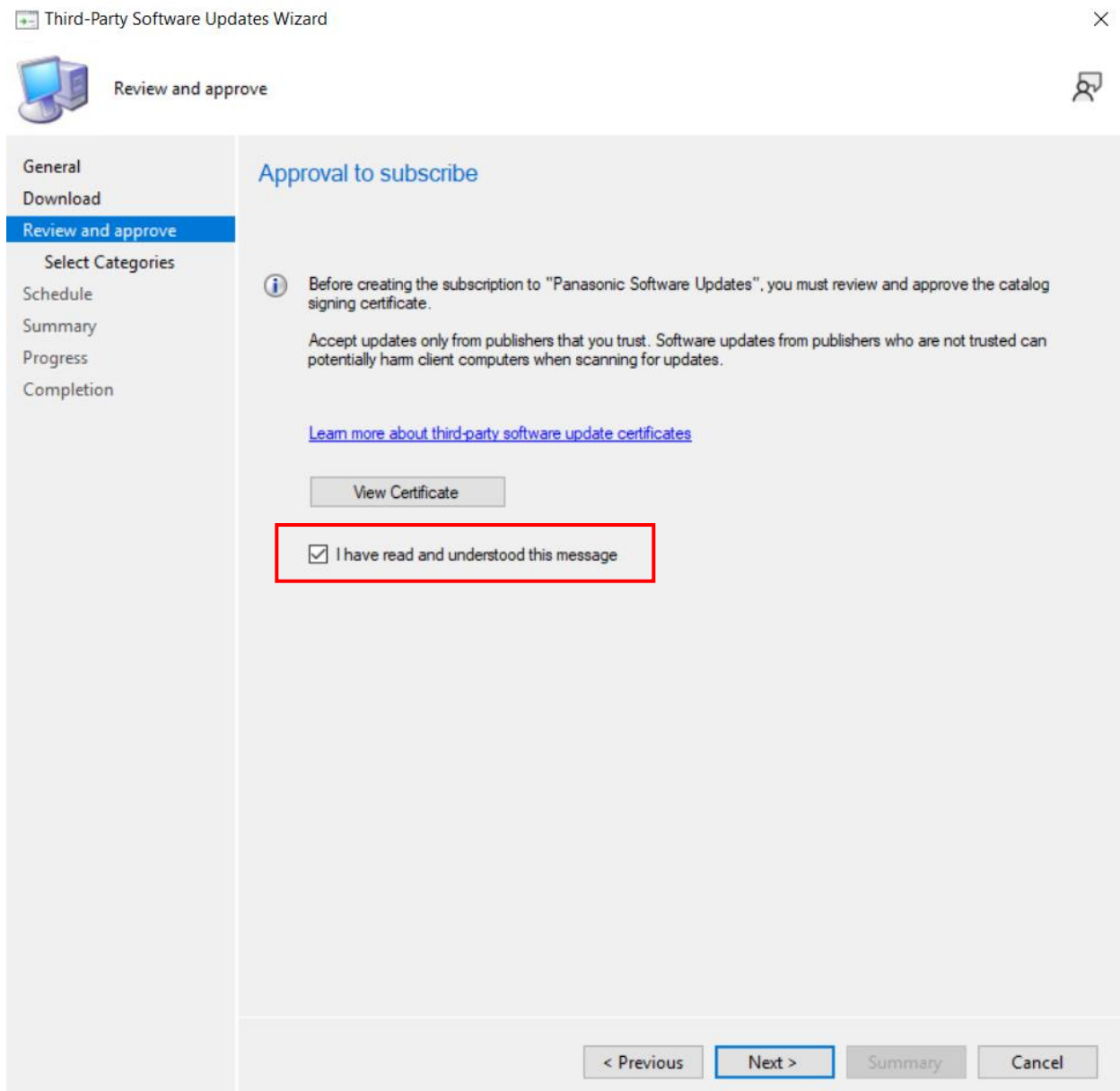
5.4. Review the catalog signing certificate

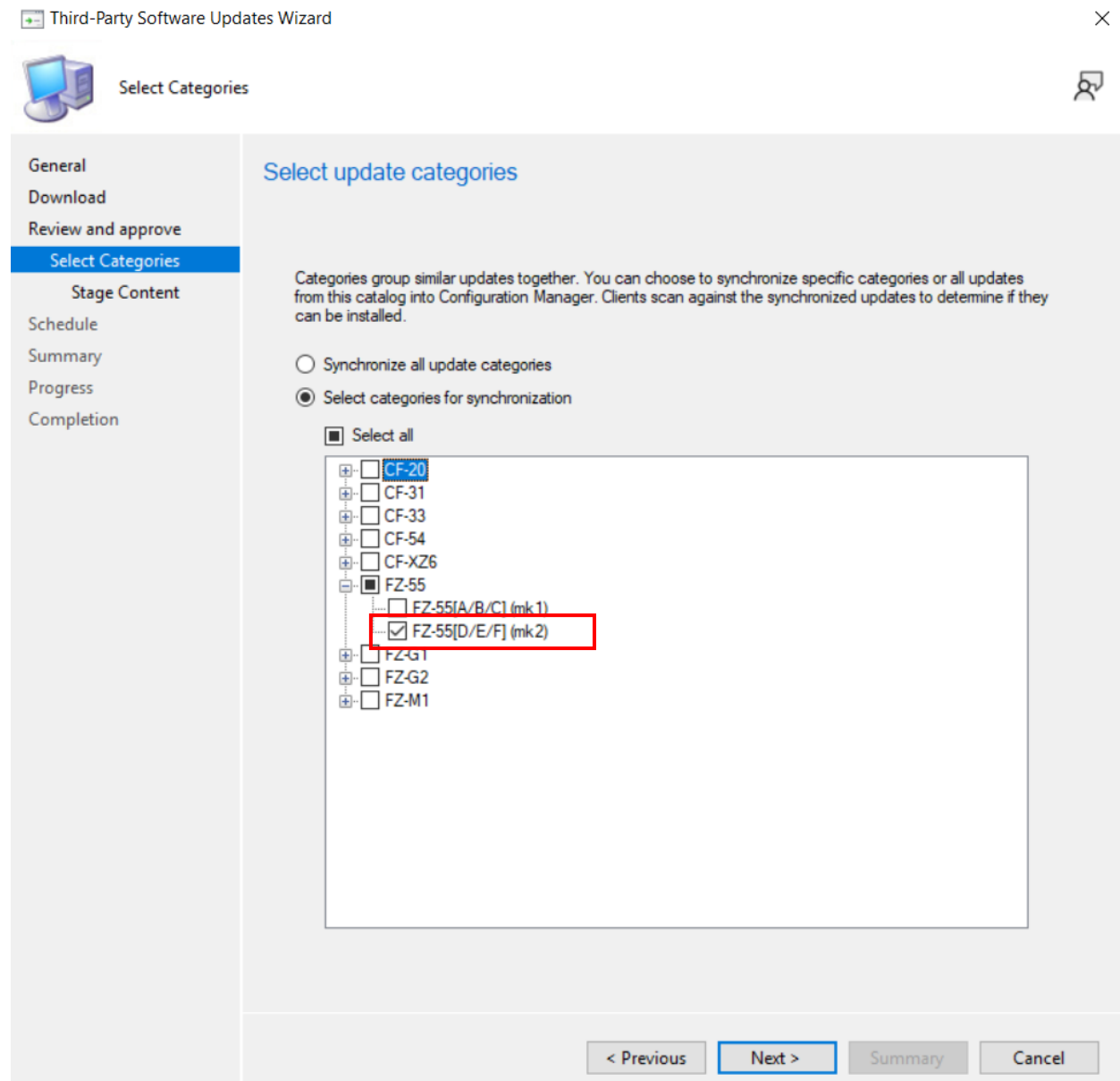

5.6. Select update categories

Select the categories that you want to synchronize. You can configure synchronization to include only specific categories of updates to avoid synchronizing the entire catalog.



5.7. Stage update content

If you choose “Do not stage content, synchronize for scanning only (recommended)”, you need to publish the updates before downloading the update binaries.

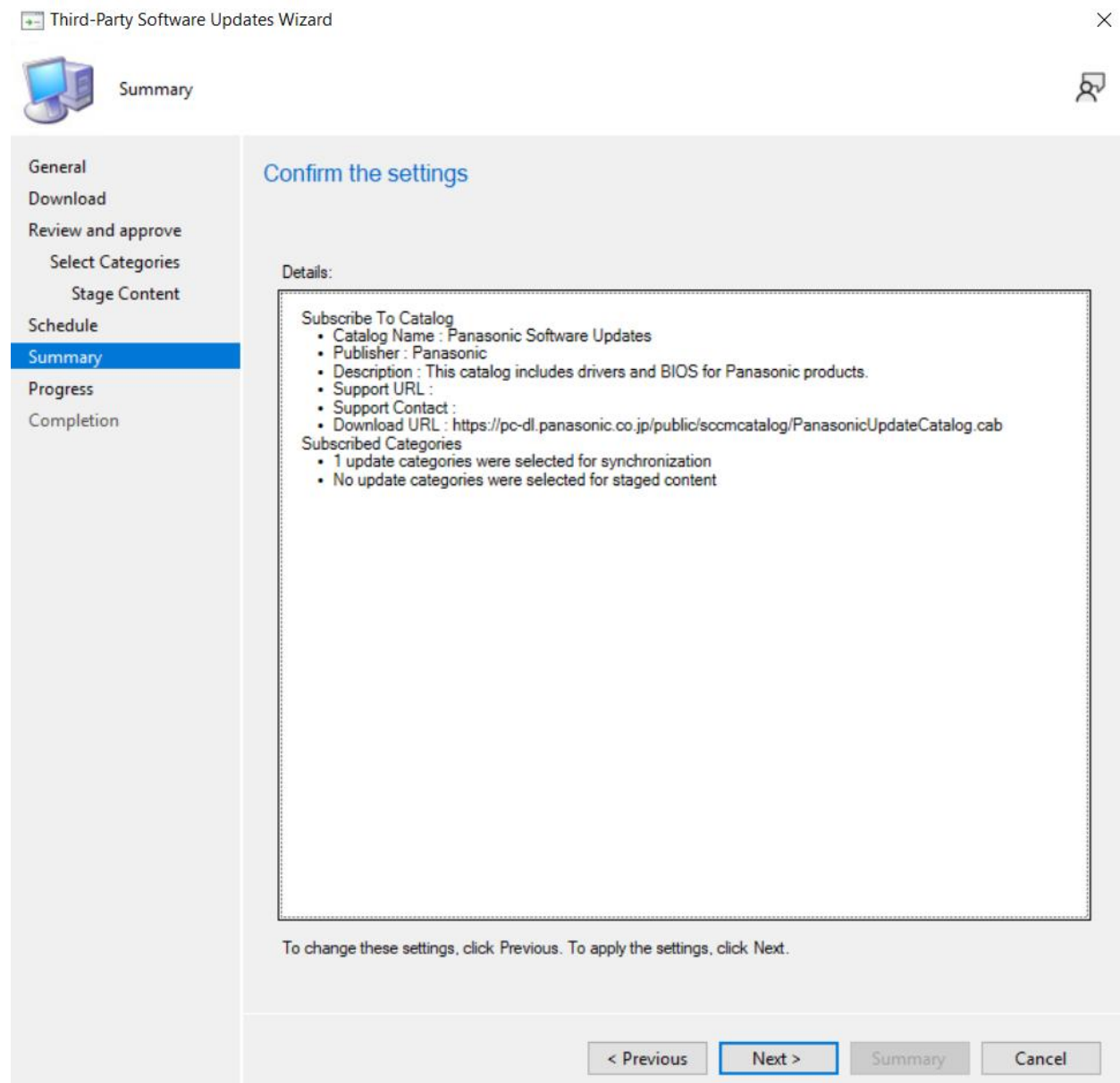

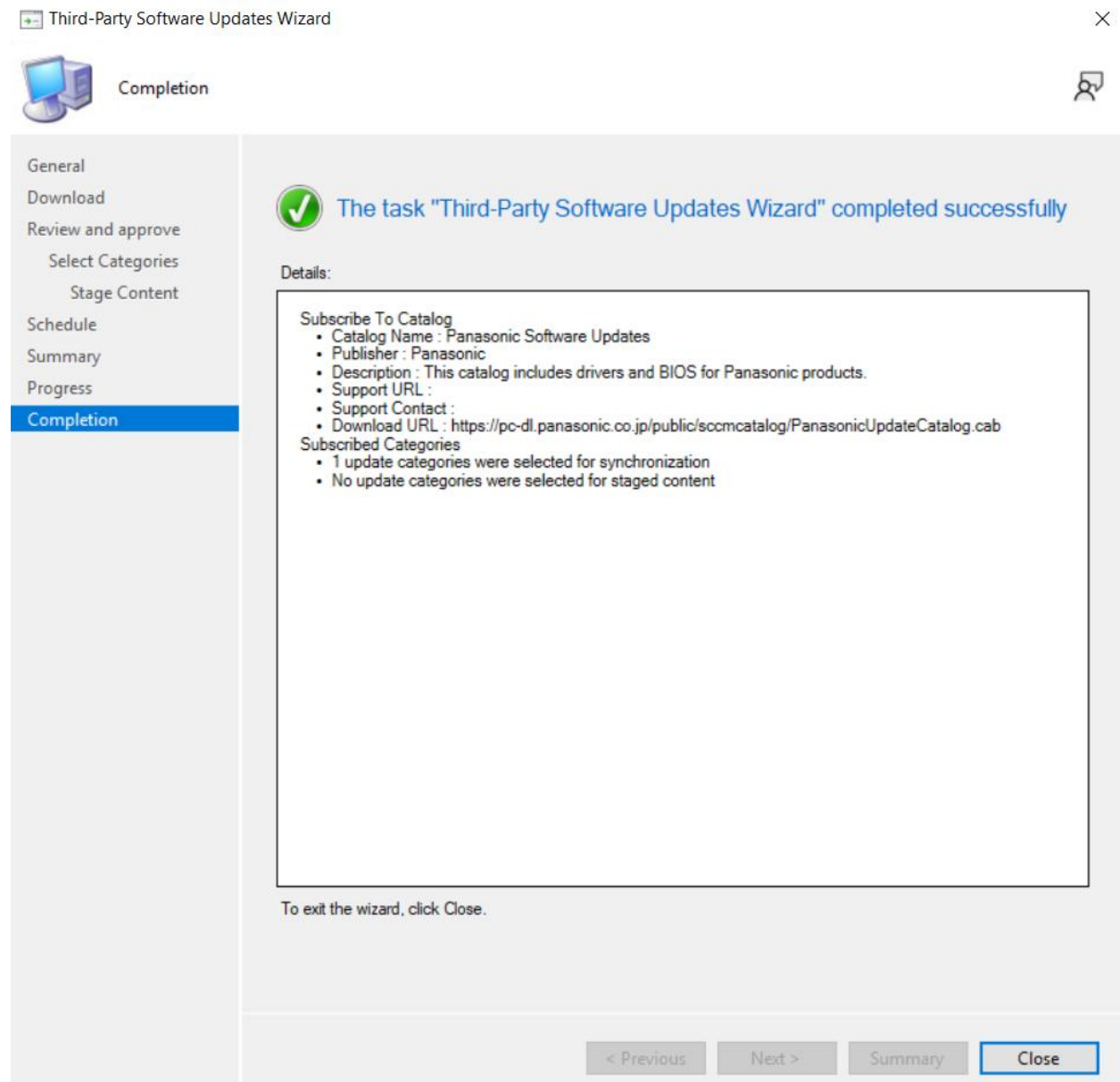

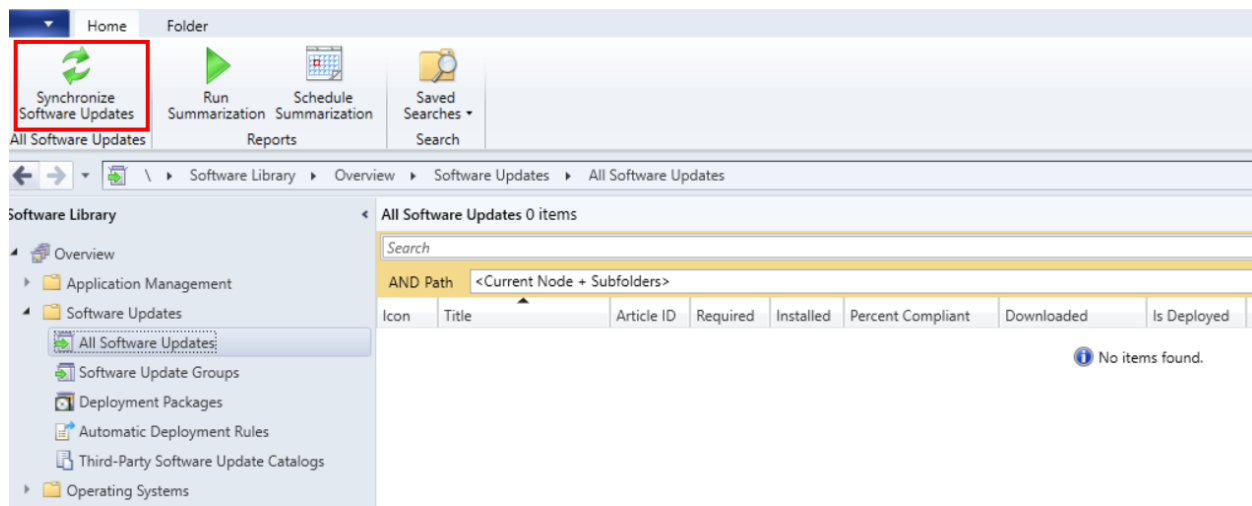
6. Synchronize Software Updates

6.1. Synchronize products

To pull the products category from WSUS, run normal software update synchronization.

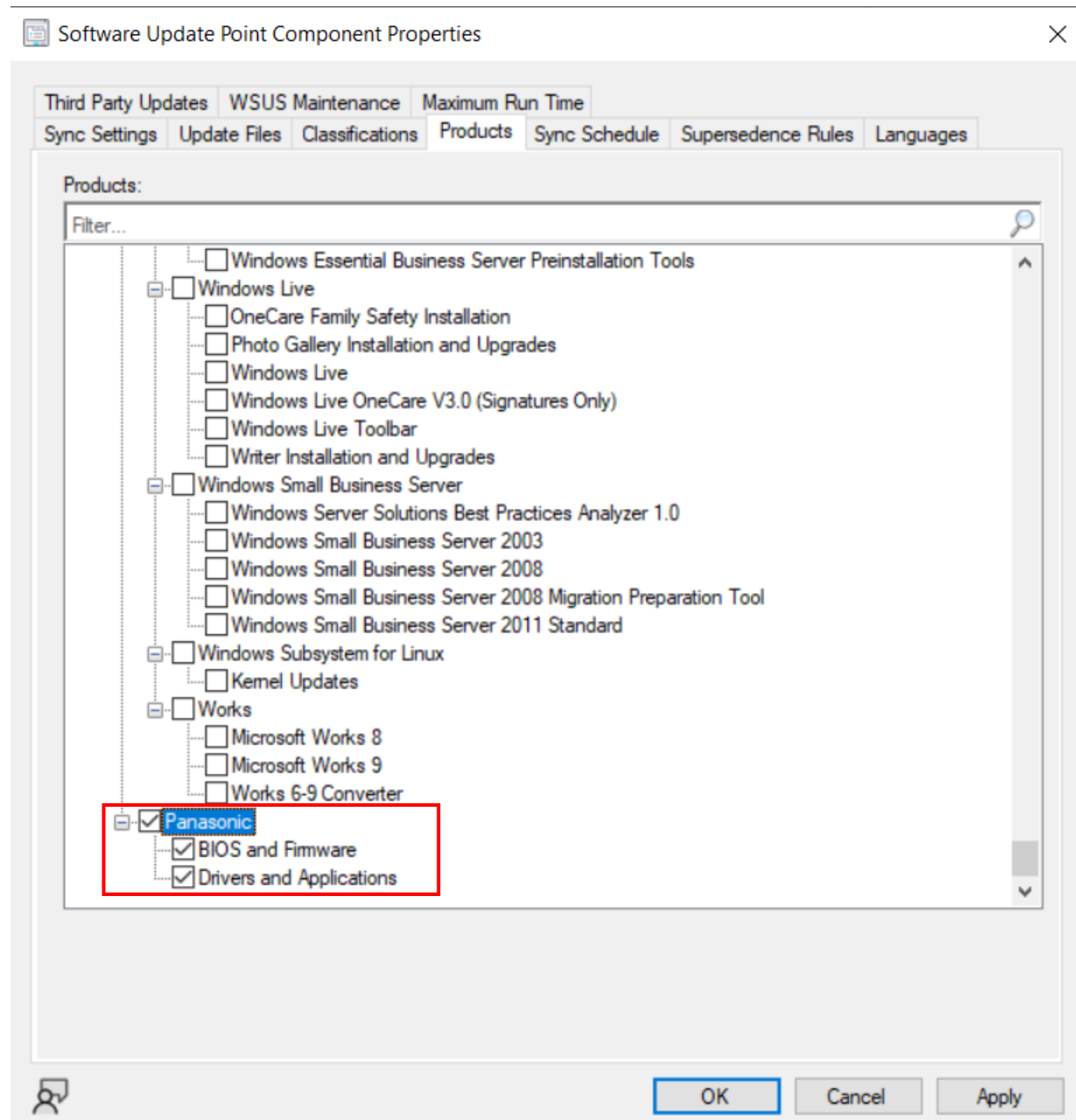
Select **Software Library > Overview > Software Updates > All Software Updates**. Click **Synchronize Software Updates**.

If you want to confirm the status of the synchronization, open the wsyncmgr.log located in C:\Program Files\Microsoft Configuration Manager\Logs.



6.2. Select Products

Select **Administration > Site Configuration > Sites > Configure Site Components > Software Update Point > Products**. Select [Panasonic] – [BIOS and Firmware] and [Drivers and Applications].

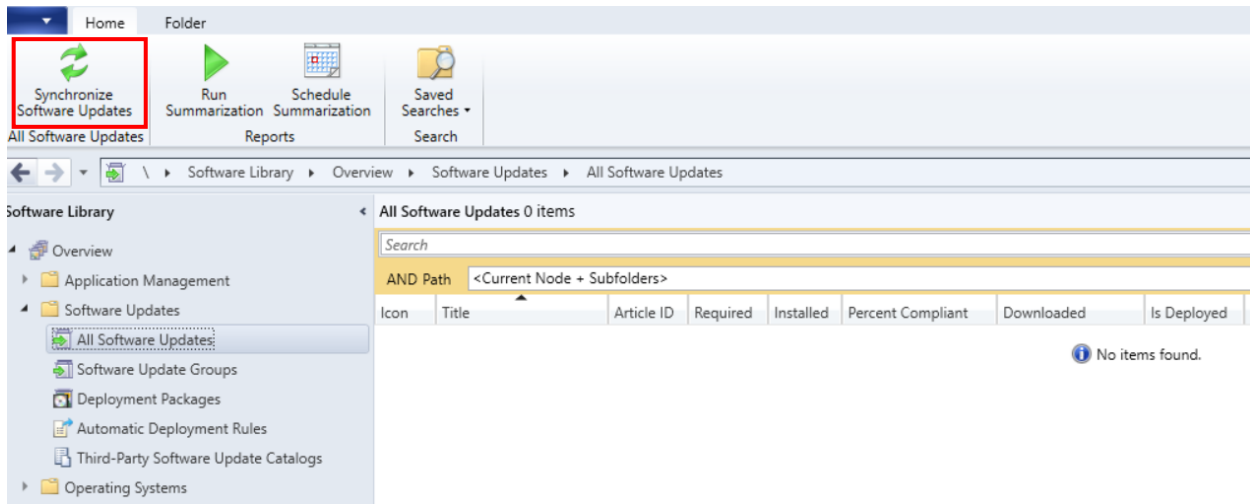


6.3. Synchronize Software Updates

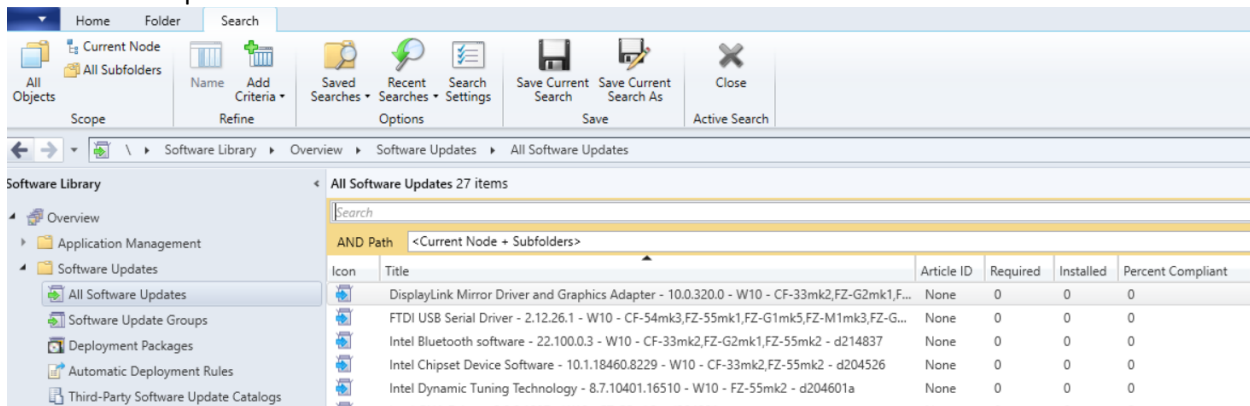
To pull software updates from WSUS, run normal software update synchronization.

Select **Software Library > Overview > Software Updates > All Software Updates**. Click **Synchronize Software Updates**.

If you want to confirm the status of the synchronization, open the wsyncmgr.log located in C:\Program Files\Microsoft Configuration Manager\Logs.

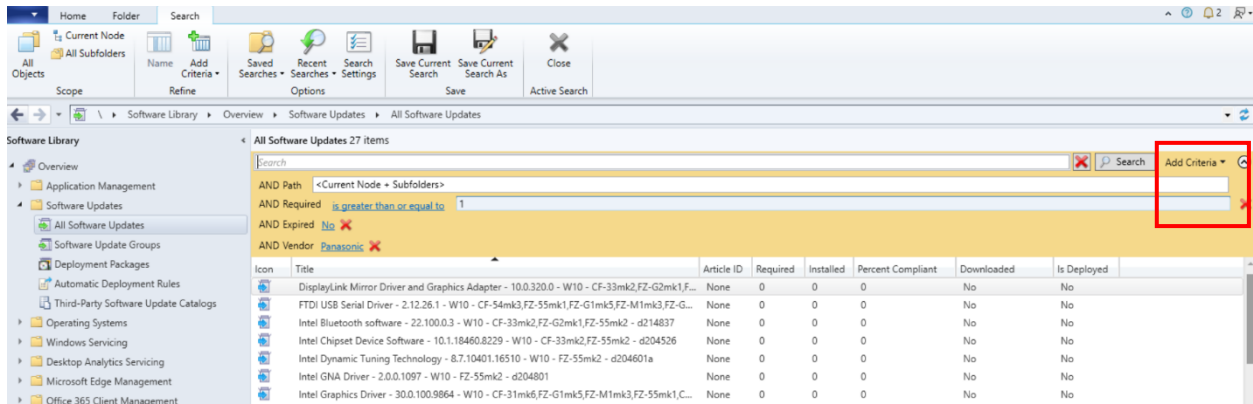
6.4. Filter drivers

Select **Add Criteria**. Check **Required**, **Expired** and **Vendor**. Specify the criteria as the following.

Required: is greater than or equal to 1

Expired: No

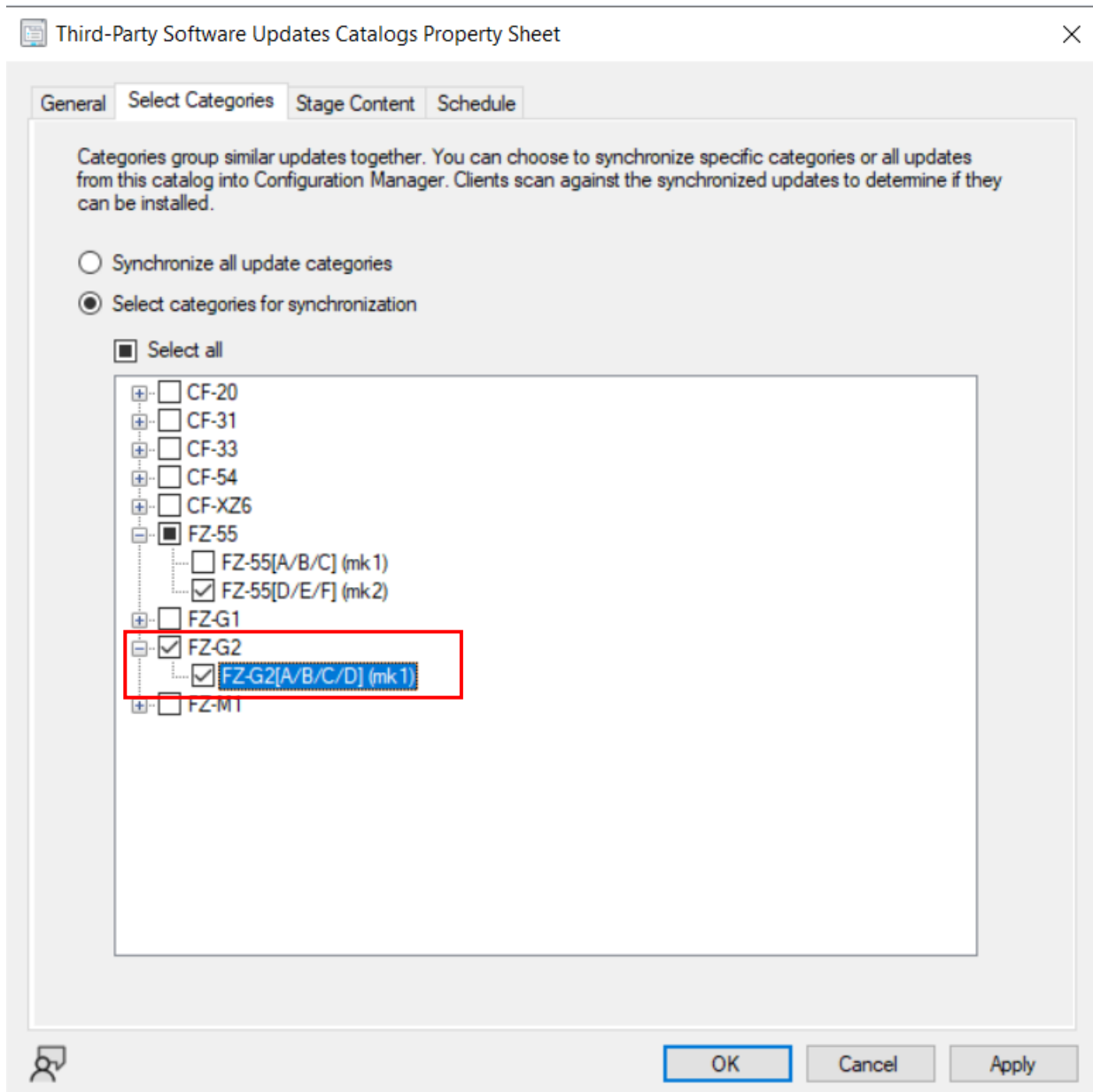

7. Add target models

7.1. Select models

If you want to add target models, select **Software Library > Software Updates > Third-Party Software Update Catalogs**. Select the catalog and click **Properties**. Select desired models.



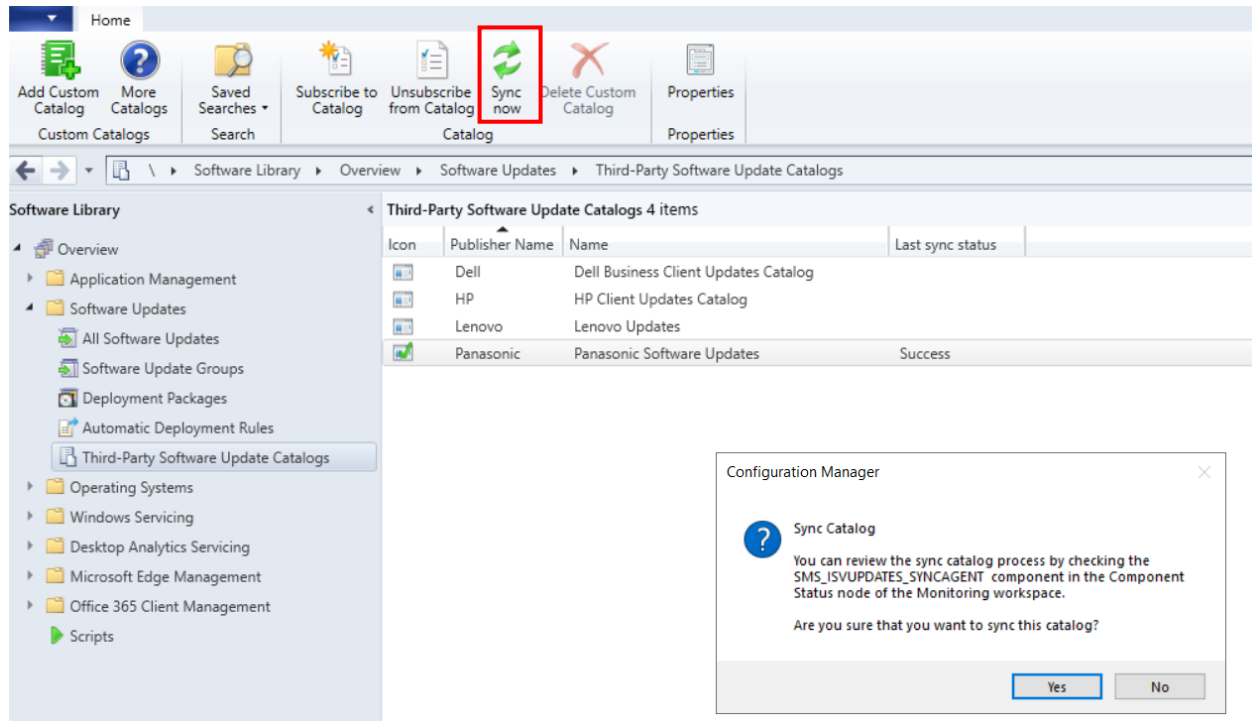

7.2. Sync catalog

To push the catalog to WSUS, run catalog synchronization.

Select **Software Library > Software Updates > Third-Party Software Update Catalogs**. Click **Sync now**.

If you want to confirm the status of the synchronization, open the SMS_ISVUPDATES_SYNCAGENT.log located in C:\Program Files\Microsoft Configuration Manager\Logs.

7.3. Synchronize Software Updates

To pull software updates from WSUS, run normal software update synchronization.

Select **Software Library > Software Updates > All Software Updates**. Click **Synchronize Software Updates**. Check wsyncmgr.log and wait for the synchronization.

If you want to confirm the status of the synchronization, open the wsyncmgr.log located in C:\Program Files\Microsoft Configuration Manager\Logs.
